

Synopsis of District Baseline Survey Analysis

With a view to prepare effective action plan on B.R.G.F, the Baseline Survey was conducted during last year. This was primarily done to identify the critical gap of the ongoing development activities of this District. On analysis of that Baseline Survey, it reveals that there has been considerably gap in some of the ongoing flagship programme as well as other development activities running for last several years.

The activities in the following sectors are to be intensified for overall development of the district :

- (1) **Infrastructure of I.C.D.S** : Out of 4130 Anganwadi Centers, 1856 centers only having its own pucca building. The structure for the remaining centers should be built within a specific time frame. A time bound action plan should be prepared tapping B.R.G.F as well as other available source of fund.
- (2) **Basic Infrastructure for S.S.Ks & M.S.Ks** : As many as 17 S.S.Ks and 7 M.S.Ks of this District are running without basic minimum infrastructure. Priority has been given to upgrade infrastructure of S.S.Ks & M.S.Ks in B.R.G.F and from other sources.
- (3) **Drinking Water and Sanitation** : There has been a scarcity of drinking water in many of the isolated hamlets of this District. The problem aggravates during summer season due to depletion of ground water in some areas. The District being drought prone, supply of drinking water throughout the year has become a major challenge for the District Authority. Priority has been accorded for providing drinking water sources in such un-reached areas especially in isolated hamlets having SC, ST & Minority population.
- (4) **Improvement of road connectivity** : In spite of running P.M.G.S.Y work for last several years, the road connectivity could not be established in many of the areas throughout the District. Though at present all the P.R.Is are giving due priority on establishing road connectivity, paucity of fund has become a major constraint.
- (5) **Public Health** : Though many of the public health programmes are running under supervision of Health Department with active involvement of P.R.Is, the infrastructure needs to be improved in the grass root level for better coverage.
